Volunteer Code of Conduct - Howling for Wolves

Above all, be respectful to the public, the police and each other. We're in this for the wolves!

Please do not enter into a confrontation with a person that has opposing views. If they are the only ones arguing, you will be viewed well by those watching. If you push too hard, they may work against us. Do not create animosity or give someone motivation to work against us.

You can be arrested for not leaving an 'unlawful assembly.' If asked by police to leave, you must leave.

Do not trespass on private property. Stay on public sidewalks.

No firearms or weapons are allowed at Howling for Wolves' activities.

Anyone who steps outside the law or our code, will no longer be a volunteer at Howling for Wolves. Your actions reflect on us.

Megaphones will be limited at demonstrations. You must receive permission from Howling for Wolves to use one. Our signs speak volumes.

When distributing information, if someone does not want one, move on. Again, do not enter into communication that is viewed as confrontation.

Knowledge is key. Be informed and up-to-date on the wolf and the hunt issues. Do not spread information you *think* is right, know the facts!

If you are not sure about something, ask. Better to ask, then do something that can be bad for the wolves' cause.

Remember, you are in this for the wolves, we don't have a lot of time.

Use the time wisely and we will make a difference.
